We had an estimated 75 visitors from 7:15 am until 11:15 when we took the nets down. We had a group of 15-25 people pretty continuously from about 8:30 until 11:15. We banded or recaptured 53 individuals from 24 species (see Purple for # ind banded). We saw or heard an additional 41 species (see Blue) for a grand total of 65 species captured or found at the banding station during the morning. We banded 10 species of warblers and saw/heard an additional 6 species for a total of 16 warbler species.
